
NPSW Phonics Lesson structure



Sequence of teaching in a discrete phonics session



Introduction

- Share objectives
- Segment + Blend starter in Phonics Screening Style (3 words)

Revisit and Review

- Practise previously learned letters/graphemes/adjacent consonants
- Practise oral blending and segmentation

Teach

- Teach a new letter
- Teach blending and/or segmentation with letters/graphemes/adjacent consonants
- Teach one or two tricky words

Practise

Practise reading and/or spelling words with the new letter/graphemes/adjacent consonants

Apply

• Read or write a caption (with the teacher) using one or more high-frequency words and words containing the new letter/graphemes/adjacent consonants

Recording

- Phase 2, 3, 4 and 5 are to use whiteboards to ensure progress and pace is speedy. Beyond phase 5 to record work in phonics books.
- Application will be seen in children's writing and reading.
