Year 4 visited Sarehole Mill in Birmingham to complement their science learning. We were blessed with some calmer weather and pupils learned about the mill and its functions.



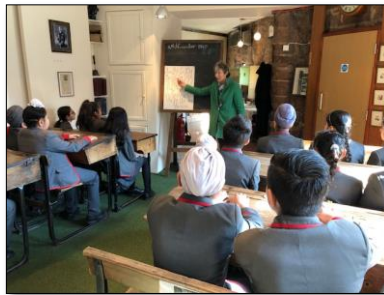
## Year 4 visit to the Synagogue

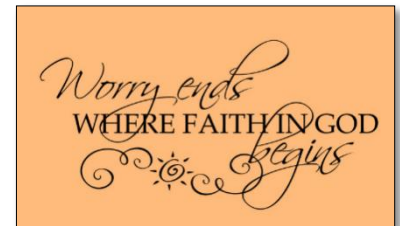
