Repeat guidance around COVID-19 self-isolation and symptoms

We appreciate that when your child shows signs of any illness at the moment, it can be stressful and some parents have been finding it hard to know what to do. Please see below for a summary of the guidance we sent out in our letters this week, taken directly from the NHS.

What to do if your child develops symptoms of COVID 19

If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19, they must not come to school and should remain at home for at least **10 days** from the date when their symptoms appeared. Anyone with symptoms will be eligible for testing and this can be arranged via <u>https://www.nhs.uk/ask-for-a-coronavirus-test</u> or by calling 119.

All other household members who remain well, must stay at home and not leave the house for 14 days. This includes anyone in your 'Support Bubble'.

The 14-day period starts from the day when the first person in the house became ill.

Household members should not go to work, school or public areas and exercise should be taken within the home.

The most common symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are recent onset of:

- a new continuous cough
- a high temperature
- a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)

If your child is displaying any other symptoms and is well enough to come to school, please do send them in.

Our school office is still experiencing a high volume of calls asking for advice on this matter, so hopefully this information will also help to reduce the number of calls we are receiving.

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
NSWL Primary Head Boy and Head Girl



Students in English drew reading rivers, mapping out their reading histories and habits. Can you spot any familiar titles? **E. Evans**






Geography : (Year 7)



Studying geography develops better Spatial Quareness. It is important to Learn map Sense and gube reading Skills. It helps you to have mapping abilities.


) Geography teaches important Life Skills, personal Learning and thinking Skills Such as problem Solving Skills and critical analysis with investigation.




