Pupils have unquestionably been showing these virtues in their academic work already, but what has been most impressive is their willingness to take on board all the new rules and systems and follow them so diligently both in lessons and around the building.

Finally, I would like to say a huge thank you to our staff, who have done a tremendous job in yet again adapting to a new set of circumstances, which they have done skillfully and selflessly. We are very lucky to have such a positive team.

#### Key routines for parents

**Morning access to the site –** Please do not try to access the site before **8am.** Some parents have been walking through the Syon Lane vehicle gate before 8am. We would respectfully ask you to time your arrival so that you reach the gate at 8am or after, at which point the pedestrian gates will open and you will be able to walk through.

**Pedestrian one-way system at the Syon Lane entrance -** If you are using the Syon Lane entrance, please remember that primary parents use the left-hand pavement to walk in and the main drive to walk out, whilst secondary pupils use the right-hand pavement to walk in and out. Secondary parents are not permitted on site unless they have a pre-arranged appointment. Please also remember to social distance - **remain a minimum of 2m from people in other households.** 

**Parking -** We are aware that many families are new to NSWL, so may not quite be familiar with the rules around parking, pick up and drop off around our site, which are as follows:

- The agreed drop off and pick up / park and stride locations are Tesco car park and Osterley Garden Centre only.
- As per our planning permissions / agreed travel plan with the local authority, there is strictly no parking on our site and no drop off / pick up at the entrance to the school.

All parents please be aware that new cameras have been installed on the A4 slip road near Wood Lane, so any parents who drive down there will receive a £130 fine.

On the whole, parents have been highly respectful of our parking guidelines this week, for which we are very grateful.

All of this said, please, where possible, walk, cycle or scoot into school and if your child is in secondary, send them in unaccompanied. For the health and environmental benefits, we encourage you to do your utmost to avoid using your cars, especially if you live within a one-mile radius of the school.

### **Library Development**

We are excited to announce that over the summer, building works have taken place to install a mezzanine level in our main school library. As you can see in the pictures below, there is a large new space for pupils to use. A phased plan of new stock and library furniture will be rolled out over the next few years to ensure that we have a facility fit for use by all pupils up to the age of 18. We want to say a heartfelt thank you to all the volunteers who came in and worked on the project at various stages, giving their time and skills selflessly.







#### **Travel Information**

This week we have been contacted by an organisation called the National Schools Partnership, who have kindly provided us with the following information for parents:

To support a safe and sustainable return to school, we are:

- Encouraging walking, cycling or scooting where possible
- Adding more than 230 extra buses as School Services on some of the busiest low frequency routes
- Designating some existing buses as School Services on high frequency routes, which can then operate at full seated capacity in line with Government guidelines
- Asking other customers to avoid busier times

Please note that children aged 11 or over will need to wear face coverings on our services.

Dear Parents and Carers,

As we come to the end of the summer break, which has been a most unusual one, we do hope that you have managed to have some kind of a break and are ready for the return back to school .We are aware that for many of our families, the past five months have been an anxious time and incredibly worrying for all.

As we start a new school year it is vital that all our children and young people return to school. This is the right approach we know Coronavirus has not gone away and that we all need to keep ourselves and each other safe. However, our children must not suffer educationally or socially and right now school is the best place for them to be.

Over the summer our Headteachers and their school staff have been working tremendously hard on their plans to welcome back all school-aged children and young people from September, which we are very grateful. All of their hard work and preparations help to ensure a very safe start to the new school year, and we fully support all that our school community have been doing. Schools in the borough have opened successfully over the last two days and it has been heartwarming to see large numbers of children returning, full of excitement and settling into the new routines and expectations quickly.
