Nursery

In Nursery, this half-term, we have been busy learning all about 'Cool Creatures'. Each week we have focused on a different animal book, such as *Brown Bear, Brown Bear, What Do You See?* and *Aaaarrgghh Spider!* We have talked about different animals and insects and where they live, and we have also enjoyed singing some animal-related nursery rhymes. We are becoming experts at joining in with songs and rhymes during carpet time!



In phonics the Wrens have been using the Little Wandle scheme to learn about syllables and rhyming words, while the Penguins have been practising our key rhymes. In Maths, we have continued to work on counting, 2D shapes and ordering numbers. In our daily 'Funky Fingers' sessions we have done lots of threading and pinching activities, as well as Lego building and Dough Disco.



In our Early Years provision we have done lots of activities and crafts linked to our weekly texts, and some of our artwork has been displayed on the working wall. We continue to focus on sharing skills and showing kindness to others while being busy in Nursery.







Our graduation was a great success, and it was a fantastic opportunity for the staff and parents to celebrate the children's achievements. We also loved taking part in Sports Day and got lots of stickers for running fast!

From all the Nursery team, we are so proud of the children and hope everyone has a fantastic summer holiday!



Reception

What a busy final half term! Over the past couple of weeks, we have been exploring the wild world of animals, from jungle critters to deep-sea creatures! To kick start our topic we visited Temple Newsam, where we learnt all about the workings of a real farm, got to hold some of the animals and even ride a tractor! The children really impressed us with their behaviour and it was a wonderful day for everyone. A huge thank you to the parents who supported us on the trip.









In Maths we have been reading the story 'All about Legs!' This sparked lots of lovely discussion about different animals and how to classify them but also how to count in twos, add together and subitise! The children have also been using Numicon and the Rekenreks to support their understanding of number bonds to 10.

Science has been a highlight for us this term; we have explored different habitats and matched animals to their homes. In the forest we found lots of mini beasts including centipedes, woodlice and spiders!

Reception have been preparing themselves for the transition to Year 1 – it has been very emotional for the staff to see how far they've come! We are so proud of the progress that the children have made, and it's been a privilege to work with each and every one of them. We wish you all a lovely summer!



Year 1

It has been a wonderful term in Year 1. In English we enjoyed our story The Snail and the Whale by Julia Donaldson and learned lots of new things about snails and whales. We conducted some research on the animals and collated them together to create our own fact files which was our final piece of writing this year. It was really fun learning lots of new things about animals we didn't know much about! The class showed how mature and sensible they were when collating their own facts and taking ownership of their learning. We all did so incredibly well, Miss Read is really proud of our efforts. We have had a busy term with tests and the children have all done so well with the phonics screening test, our results are amazing and everyone should be so proud!







In Geography we developed our understanding of the weather in the UK, and learned to understand that weather is different in different areas. We can confidently say which country and county we live in, as well as naming the capital cities of the UK. We conducted lots of fieldwork this term and loved being out and about around the school grounds. We observed the weather changes in summer and created our own weather diary to show our observations. This worked very well with our Science topic, where we were investigating the weather in seasons and what materials would be best for preparing us for these different weathers. We conducted some scientific experiments and made predictions which materials would protect us from all-weather types.





It has been a fabulous term preparing the class for Year 2 and we have had so many extra-curricular activities to get involved with. Well done to the Primley's Got Talent competitors, our new Class Ambassadors and our new pupil leaders who will be leading a subject area going into Year 2. All of the adults in Year 1 are very proud of the class and can see them being fantastic Year 2 children, Miss Read will miss them very much.

Year 2

It has been a very exciting half term in Year 2. We began with a science trip to the children's museum called 'Eureka,' where the children learnt about earth in space and the human body. They also drove cars, a bus and ran the local bank! In Science we've been learning about life cycles (animals and humans) and this has fitted nicely into understanding the transition to Key Stage 2.

Year 2 worked really hard practising for sports day and had an amazing time—they loved the cycle of skills and enjoyed all the races. We have some very talented athletes! I can't wait to see what they'll be doing by Year 6!

We've enjoyed learning about the coast in Geography, programming in computing and writing and understanding jokes for the Primley Wood Talent Show. Maths has been challenging, as the children prepare for Year 3 learning and in English lessons the children wrote instructions for (and made) musical instruments. They have been really hard working this half term, and we wish them a happy summer break.





Year 3 Falcons

What a busy half term it has been in Falcons! We've enjoyed a wonderful sports day and talent show, and loved seeing all of the parents who could attend.

Pretty sure we'll be so ready for Year 4: In Maths we've been recapping our addition, multiplication and division strategies and thinking about which methods are appropriate for which type of questions. Conducting our own research for our statistics work was also a highlight. In Science, we have been exploring working scientifically: developing testable questions, making predictions, recording results, writing methods and drawing conclusions. One of our favourites was conducting a fair test by changing one variable in baking a cake - and trying our cakes afterwards!







We were also surprised to see how well tomato ketchup cleans coins and came to the conclusion that this is to do with how acidic it is. We loved making solar ovens too and making predictions about which would be the

most efficient. It was a bit of a surprise that the chocolate inside the packet melted faster than the chocolate in any of our ovens! We finished our English with a flourish: writing diary entries and dialogues based on the story Gorilla by Anthony Browne. We hope you enjoy reading them as much as we enjoyed writing them.

It's been a pleasure teaching your fantastic Falcons this year. They have really done you - and themselves-proud. Each and every one has been amazing, and will be sorely missed. All the best for Year 4!

Year 3 Sparrowhawks


Year 3 Sparrowhawks have had a fantastic final half term, filled with exciting activities and learning experiences. A highlight of the half-term was Sports Day, where they all showed great enthusiasm and sportsmanship towards one another and the other classes. This term's after-school clubs were a big hit, with cooking club and football club being particular favourites with both the girls and boys. In Maths, for their statistics topic, they have collected data from their classmates (their favourite colour) and represented this in a bar chart and pictogram, making sure to include a key. In Geography, they compared the physical and human features of our local area with those in New Delhi by exploring maps on a computer.

Sparrowhawks have also showcased their creativity by writing diary entries from the main character's perspective. In Science, Sparrowhawks have enjoyed their scientific enquiry topics conducting a range of investigations. They have cleaned coins using different substances, finding out if it was acidic or alkaline by using litmus paper. In addition, they explored the effects of changing variables by baking cakes and testing this out.

Overall, Year 3 have had such a fantastic year and we are all so proud of the progress they have made and their increasingly independent, mature attitude. They truly are ready for Year 4 and we will miss them immensely. Well done, Year 3!

In English, our creative students brought the story of 'Krindlekrax' to life by writing their own play-scripts. Their imaginative interpretations were truly impressive. Our budding geographers also delved deep into the fascinating world of volcanoes, exploring their formation and impact on the environment. Their enthusiasm was contagious as they created vibrant models and detailed reports, showcasing their understanding of these powerful natural wonders.

In our commitment to fostering environmental awareness, Kestrels tackled the important topic of animal conservation. Through research, debate and creative presentations, they learned about endangered species and ways to protect our planet's biodiversity. We have enjoyed a drama lesson to begin our play script writing topic and the children enthusiastically took part in a number of activities including role play. Maths has been focussed on shape, position and direction in which we have looked at 2D shapes and using mathematical language to describe position and movement on a grid. The children are also working hard thinking about maths that they can see every day. In science, Year 4 have been thinking about the effects pollution has on the earth, the air and water; we have been thinking about ways that we can help the planet and how we can have a positive impact on the world around us. In P.E. we have been developing our cricket skills and have enjoyed playing cricket in teams. We have also had lots of fun taking part in school events such as Sports Day, Primley's Got Talent and having the opportunity to be leaders in school.

Overall, the class have had a great term with lots of learning and fun. The children have shown incredible resilience and are ready to start the new and exciting learning in Year 5.

Phonics Success!

The implementation of our new phonics scheme, Little Wandle for Letters and Sounds, has continued to go from strength to strength this half term. Children in Reception have completed their first full year of the programme and have grown into confident readers who are able to talk about the texts they are reading. The Year 1 class have absolutely knocked our socks off with their amazing scores in the Phonics Screening Check. With 80% of the class having reached the pass mark, this is our highest result for several years. Well done Year One! Children in Year 2 have been taught using the Little Wandle Spelling Programme and Mrs Kennedy reports that it has had a wonderful impact on children's confidence when spelling challenging words. We will be holding a Phase 2 Phonics Workshop in the school hall on Monday 9th September at 9.00am. This is aimed at parents of Reception children or those learning phonics for the first time – however all parents are welcome to learn about how we teach Phonics! A huge well done and thank you to Mrs Rai for implementing this programme across school.




Our Summer Fayre




Great Primley Wood Bake Off!
