



Impact of Year 7 Catch Up Premium Funding 2018 - 19

19 pupils joined Nishkam School West London with a reading scaled score of less than 100 from their Key Stage 2 SATs.

15 pupils joined Nishkam School West London with a Maths scaled score of less than 100 from their Key Stage 2 SATs.

English:

58% moved forward one whole progress threshold during Year 7

42% moved forward within the same threshold

27% moved forward one whole progress threshold during Year 7

73% moved forward within the same threshold

Year 7 Catch Up Premium Spending – Intended expenditure for 2019 - 20

Nishkam School West London is committed to ensuring that every pupil 'can and will achieve'. As a state-funded school we receive funding called the literacy and numeracy catch-up premium. This initiative gives schools additional funding to support Year 7 pupils who did not achieve the expected standard in reading or maths at the end of Key Stage 2.

In 2018/19 Nishkam School West London received an additional approximate £6, 400 in Year 7 Catch Up Premium funding; we anticipate that funding will increase slightly for 2019/20, as there is an additional form of entry in this year's cohort.

We therefore intend to spend the Year 7 Catch Up Premium (2019/20) on:

- Curriculum spending to improve reading and numeracy, including the launch of Accelerated Reader (resources/training/library stock enhanced) - £6,000
- Contribution to Year 7 reading & maths teaching assistants, including 1-2-1 interventions and classroom support - £2,000

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
